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Management of acute pain after orthopedic surgery has changed significantly during the last decade. Formerly a task relegated to residents and ward nurses, analgesia is now being managed by increasingly large numbers of Anesthesiologists and members of surgical teams.

Guidelines on the Management of Postoperative Pain

Managing acute postoperative pain is a major challenge for practitioners, given that more than 80% of patients report pain after surgery, and 75% report the pain as moderate, severe, or even extreme. 1-2 In more than half of cases, patients report not receiving adequate pain management following their procedure, 1 which raises concerns over the development of chronic pain down the line.

Introduction Acute pain is one of the most common symptoms, for which physicians are consulted. It is a symptom informing the organism about tissue insult (caused by injury, disease, surgical procedure, or childbirth) in order to prevent further damage.

A proper approach to acute postoperative pain management must include an appropriate assessment tool. A 10-point pain assessment scale, where 1 is no pain and 10 is the worst possible pain imaginable, has been nationally accepted. The rating given to the

Acute pain management: operative or medical procedures and ...

The World Health Organization (WHO) developed a stepwise approach to chronic pain management, which is often applied to the management of acute pain. This is known as the WHO pain ladder. 12 Opioids (synthetic opium derivatives) are used for the treatment of moderate-to-severe pain.

The primary goal in acute pain management is to promote the resolution of the underlying causes of pain while providing effective analgesia. 18 Acute pain can be managed using both pharmacologic and nonpharmacologic techniques (including physical therapy) either in isolation or more often in combination. 19,20 This section focuses on pharmacologic management while the next section will describe physical therapy management considerations.

The Management of Acute Postoperative Pain

A. Definition of Acute Pain Management in the Perioperative Setting For these Guidelines, acute pain is defined as pain that is present in a surgical patient after a procedure. Such pain may be the result of trauma from the procedure or procedure-related complications.

Acute Pre & Post-Operative Pain Management

The Acute Pain Management Guideline Panel recommends that any hospital in which abdominal or thoracic operations are routinely performed offer patients postoperative regional anesthetic, epidural or intrathecal opioids, PCA infusions, and other interventions requiring a similar level of expertise, under the supervision of an acute pain service as described in summary recommendation 6.
