Protein binding of local anesthetics is reduced in pregnant women with preeclampsia or eclampsia; therefore, a large amount of local anesthetics can be transferred to the fetus. Moreover, epinephrine included in a dental cartridge can significantly contract the blood vessels inside the uterus and reduce the blood flow to the placenta.

ACOG has released guidance on the management of sudden onset severe hypertension, including in the setting of preeclampsia. This can be a life-threatening event during pregnancy and requires special vigilance in the postpartum period, particularly following hospital discharge.
