The Brontë siblings were raised and educated in a strictly Anglican home. All of the Brontë children were dedicated, well-read students and Charlotte became a writer at a young age and published her first, and best known, novel Jane Eyre in 1847 under the male pseudonym of Currer Bell. All three Brontë sisters chose to write with male pseudonyms hoping to avoid the stigma and prejudice against female writers.
