### **Georgia Divorce Requirements**

Generally, you file a complaint for divorce in the Superior Court in the county where your spouse resides or, if your spouse no longer resides in Georgia, in the county of your own residence. If your spouse consents, or if your spouse previously lived with you and has been gone for less than six months, you can file in your county of residence.

To secure a no-fault divorce in Georgia, the residency requirement is six months in Georgia. You must file for divorce in your county of residence. A non-resident may file for divorce against a spouse who has been a resident of Georgia for six months. The divorce must be filed in the county in which the respondent resides.

In Georgia, you can file for a no-fault divorce by stating that the marriage is irretrievably broken. Alternatively, you can file based on one of the following fault grounds: being too closely related (cousins) mental incapacity at the time of marriage

## **E-filing Your Georgia Divorce**

To file for divorce in Georgia, you and your spouse must first become legally separated. If you are able to negotiate the terms of the divorce with your spouse, particularly issues of custody, property division and child support, you may be able to pursue an uncontested divorce. This is typically a quicker and less expensive option.

## **How to File For Divorce in Georgia (2020 Step By Step ...**

In order to file for divorce, you or your spouse must be a resident of Georgia for at least six months. If you live in Georgia, you will file in the Superior Court in the county where you live. If you don't meet the residency requirement, you will file in the county where your spouse lives.

## **How to File for Divorce in Georgia | Rocket Lawyer**

The spouse that is a resident must also be the spouse that files for divorce. It is not an advantage to be the spouse that files for divorce, and normally, spouses will have agreed to the divorce and its terms before the divorce papers are filed. In Georgia, the residency requirement before filing for divorce is six months.

## **How to complete a "do it yourself" divorce in Georgia ...**

E-filing Divorce Cases in Georgia Starting January 1, 2019, mandatory e-filing went into effect in Georgia. The new law requires attorneys to e-file the documents they file for their clients. However, e-filing is not mandatory for people who don't have attorneys, also called pro se.

## **Divorce Online Georgia — File for Divorce in Georgia ...**

The process for getting a divorce and acceptable grounds for divorce vary from state to state. In Georgia, a divorce can be completed on average in a minimum of 210 days, with court fees of \$218.00. The state has divorce residency requirements that require the spouse filing for the divorce to have lived in Georgia for a minimum of six months.

In the state of Georgia there are 13 grounds for divorce. One of these is "irretrievably broken [marriage]", or the no-fault ground. Unlike the other 12 grounds for divorce in Georgia, this means that one does not need to prove that there was any wrongdoing by

one of the parties of the marriage.

### **Legal Grounds for Divorce in Georgia - 13 Reasons to File ...**

You must file for a divorce in person in Georgia, generally in the county where your spouse resides. If the spouse lives out of state, then you can file in the county where you reside. There are several services and private attorneys who can do the bulk of the preliminary paperwork needed for divorce through electronic means.

Georgia divorce law provides for 13 legal grounds for divorce. Persons involved in a divorce need to identify only one of the legal grounds, but they may claim multiple grounds. Each of the legal grounds for divorce requires certain conditions to exist in order to formally assert any particular reason for getting a divorce in Georgia.

When you are ready to initiate the process, file your petition for divorce with the Clerk of Court in the county and state where you want to dissolve your marriage.
