The Incident Decision Tree has one purpose—to guide initial management action following a patient safety incident. It does not explore the standards of proof legally required to support claims of “recklessness,” “reckless behavior,” or “negligence.”

FOLLOW-UP VISITS: Assess asthma control to determine if therapy should be adjusted (see page 6).
