### **Speech Therapy and Language Development Goals - Bilingualistics**

Sample goals: Student will exhibit the pragmatic skills of active listening, commenting,

asking questions, and appropriately entering and exiting conversations. Given modeling and scripts, student will use language to express frustration, problems, and disagreements. Student will infer the feelings and ideas of others during role-play activities

### **Let's Talk Speech and Language: Student Learning ...**

A Student Growth Objective, or SGO, is a long-term academic goal for groups of students set by teachers in consultation with their supervisors. An effective SGO must be: Specific and measureable. Aligned to New Jersey's curriculum standards. Based on available prior student learning data.

### **Student Learning Outcomes (SLO) - Badger State Speechy**

Objectives state the disability in bold at the upper left side of each page. The goals and objectives were written with basic simplicity so that the user can adjust them to fit a particular student. The group of speech-language pathologists who created these goals

and objectives hope they will be of help to fellow colleagues throughout the state.

### **Ideas for Professional Growth Plans for School Speech ...**

Growth Goal/Target: 100% of kindergarten students receiving speech therapy as identified on their IEP's will improve speech intelligibility as measured by SLP-created data collection tools. I used 10 words from the “articulation list” from the 5 year old screener from the Preschool Language Scale (PLS) screener for categories 1 and 2.

## **Functional Life Skills Activities For Older Speech Students**

Specific goals can include helping patients develop clearer speech, learn to use alternate methods of communication, develop better reading and writing skills, and strengthen throat and neck muscles. Goals also may include coordinating treatment programs with other professionals or referring patients for other treatments.

This shift toward SLO's is a part of the new teacher rating outlined by the new APPR which is based on a 100 point system: 60% of points are based on classroom observation, 20% based on local assessments (that our district will provide as to establish a baseline for formulating SLO's for the present school year) and 20% based on student growth (measured in the form of teacher tests ...

### **My 5-Step Process to Achieving Your Goals as a Speech ...**

As school based SLPs, many of us are required to write a professional goal for ourselves each year. In my district under the Danielson model, we call it an “Individual Growth Plan,” while others may call it “Professional Development Goals,” “Professional Goal Setting,” “Professional Learning Plan,” or something similar.

A professional growth plan for a school-based speech and language pathologist should reflect his long-term occupational goals, and also should address the needs of the students served. The plan should reflect the school’s and the state’s academic goals, since students' assigned individual education plan goals are usually academic.
