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### **Even First Graders Can Write Poetry.. - Tales From a K-1 ...**

Have students read a lyrical verse poem first and underline, circle or highlight each word that rhymes. This is a good opportunity to teach rhyme schemes, such as rhyming lines one, two and four in a four-line stanza. Afterward, hand out a poem in free verse and ask students to note that rhyming is not required.

## 1st grade rhyming and poetry worksheets | Parenting

Introduction. Poems and songs often use rhyming to create a rhythm, or a repeated pattern of sound, and sometimes poems will also tell a story. Read the Ann Ran poem with words from the -an family. As you read aloud, encourage your students to find a rhythm. Stress each syllable as it is read.
