Criminal Code - laws-lois.justice.gc.ca  
The Criminal Code is a law that codifies most criminal offences and procedures in Canada. Its official long title is "An Act respecting the criminal law". Section 91 of the Constitution Act, 1867 establishes the sole jurisdiction of Parliament over criminal law in Canada. The Criminal Code contains some defences, but most are part of the common law rather than statute. Important Canadian criminal laws not forming part of the code include the Firearms Act, the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act.

Criminal Code of Canada - section 266 - Assault  
Section 380(1) Fraud is the wrongful or criminal deception intended to result in financial or personal gain. The definition of Fraud is left ambiguous in order to capture the vast nature that these offences occur.

Some samples from Canada's first Criminal Code: "If a sentence of death is passed upon any woman, she may move in arrest of execution on the ground that she is pregnant. If upon the report of (medical practitioners), it appears to the court that she is so with child, execution shall be arrested until she is delivered of a child, or until it is no longer possible in the course of nature that she be so delivered.

Criminal Code Criminal Code, a federal statute enacted by Parliament pursuant to s91(27) of the Constitution Act 1867, which provides the federal government exclusive jurisdiction to legislate criminal offences in Canada.

Section 271 of the Criminal Code sets out the offence of sexual assault. This offence replaced the more stringent offence of "rape" which no longer appears in Canada's Code. Sexual assault, is defined broadly as any assault (as defined in section 265 of the Code) that transpires in circumstances of a sexual nature.

Criminal Code of Canada - section 380(1) - Fraud  
Section 43 of the Criminal Code of Canada is a defense to assault that justifies violence against children by teachers and parents in the name of correction. It became part of our Criminal Code in 1892 and has allowed severe spanking, slapping and striking with belts and other objects.
