10 Tips for Parents of Defiant Children. Longer and harsher punishment doesn't make it more effective. 10) Above all, put tip No. 1 into practice. Ideally, you should be praising your child's behavior 90 percent of the time and punishing only 10 percent of the time. Notice your child's good behavior and give it positive attention.

'My child knows how to clean up his room, he just refuses to do it,' is a typical parental comment." How Parents Can Offer More Effective Praise for a Defiant Child. When parents do offer praise, they should be enthusiastic. "An unenthusiastic statement of 'Good' is not likely to change child behavior," says Kazdin.

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
