Of the 11 million families with children under age 18, and no spouse present, the majority are single mothers (8.5 million). Single fathers comprise the remaining 2.5 million single parent families. Married couples make up 68 percent of all families with children under age 18, compared to 93 percent in 1950.

For Parents Who Are Estranged From Adult Children

Children who grow up with only one of their biological parents (nearly always the mother) are disadvantaged across a broad array of outcomes. As shown in figure 1, they are twice as likely to drop out of high school, 2.5 times as likely to become teen mothers, and 1.4 times as likely to be idle -- out of school and out of work -- as children who grow up with both parents.

From 1991 to 2016, the number of mothers in paid employment increased. However, despite changing attitudes to parental roles, parents' employment remains very gendered, with fathers far more likely to be working full-time than mothers.
